PRIORITY DEADLINES

Naropa University uses a rolling admission policy. Applicants may apply as early as September for fall admission. Applications received between September 1 and the priority deadline will be given equal consideration. Applications received after the priority deadline will be reviewed on a space-available basis.

- January 15 for fall admission
- October 15 for spring admission

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- Parts A and B of the application form.
- \$50 nonrefundable application fee in the form of a check or money order, payable to "Naropa University." The applicant's name must be clearly indicated on the check.
- Part C - Three Essays (all must be typed and double-spaced).
- Official high school transcript for every first-year student and first-year transfer applicant (0-30 college credits).
- Official copy of a GED (if no high school diploma), which must be accompanied by #4 above.
- Official college transcripts for every university attended (must be sent in a sealed envelope from the college registrar).
- Test Scores: Original score reports for the ACT and/or SAT tests are optional. Naropa University's ACT code is 4853; SAT code is 0908.
- Letter of Recommendation: One from a teacher or guidance counselor. If you've been out of school for more than three years, the letter may be from a supervisor.
- Transfer Applicants: Supplemental applications or materials are required for the following programs: Music, Visual Arts, and Writing and Literature. Supplemental applications are available at www.naropa.edu/ugradapply or through the Admissions Office's departmental fact sheets.
- A phone or in-person interview is optional for undeclared students and required for all transfers into a major.
- Original artwork or other forms of creative expression (optional).
- For Applicants Educated Outside of the U.S.A.** All transcripts must be accompanied by a professional transcript evaluation performed by a professional evaluation firm and an official TOEFL result with a minimum score of 213/550 (computer-based/paper-based). Native English speakers may be exempt from the TOEFL exam. Please contact our office or visit www.naropa.edu/intlstudents/admissions.cfm for details.
