

Dear Student,

We appreciate your interest in the Visiting Student Program at Naropa University. While we offer a unique and exceptional educational experience, we understand that it may not be feasible for you to spend your entire bachelor's career with us. We have, therefore, created a program that allows undergraduate students to study at Naropa for one semester or year.

The Visiting Student Program allows students to register for degree classes, receive advising and participate in all Naropa activities. As a visiting student, you are encouraged to immerse yourself in the Naropa culture and community and are supported in exploring a contemplative practice such as meditation, t'ai-chi ch'uan or yoga in addition to the courses that meet your home college's major or minor requirements. Visiting students are given the opportunity to register early for classes. While not every course is open to visiting students and some may require permission of the instructor or prerequisites, we will do our very best to ensure that you are able to take the courses that meet your diverse needs and interests.

In order to be eligible for the Visiting Student Program, students must be full-time (12 credits per semester). If you are only interested in taking one or two classes each semester, please contact the Registrar's Office at 303-546-3500. If you want to attend the Jack Kerouac School of Disembodied Poetics' Summer Writing Program and receive credit, email swpr@naropa.edu or call 303-245-4600 for more information.

Our admissions counselors act as liaisons between visiting students and academic departments; students work with them to plan a path of study and gain permission to register. Visiting students are required to pay the tuition and registration fees of degree-seeking students by the tuition deadline. Tuition for the 2009–10 academic year is \$11,710 per semester for full-time undergraduate study and \$760 per undergraduate credit. Students can anticipate a 5 to 7 percent increase in tuition per year. Students visiting from other colleges or universities may not receive Naropa's financial aid, but we are willing to sign consortium agreements with your home college to enable you to receive your financial aid while visiting here. Naropa has a rolling admissions policy but asks that applications be submitted by June 30 for the fall semester and December 1 for the spring semester. Notification of an admissions decision will be given three weeks after the receipt of a complete application. Please contact our office at 303-546-3572 with any questions. If you happen to be visiting the Boulder area, campus tours are offered Monday through Friday at 2 p.m. We welcome you as a visiting student to experience the wisdom and eccentricity of Naropa University.
