Summer Writing Program 2012 Scholarships Guidelines & Application

Application Process:

Requirements:

Because our scholarships are need-based, students wishing to be considered for this aid must complete a [FAFSA](#) (U.S. citizens and permanent residents) or an International Student Aid Application by April 1, 2012. If you need assistance filling out either application, please contact Naropa's Financial Aid Office at 303-546-3509 or by email at finaid@naropa.edu.

To be considered for a scholarship, you will need to submit all of the following information in *ONE* document:

1. A complete Summer Writing Program 2012 Scholarship Application (this form). If you are applying for multiple scholarships, you must complete a separate application for each.
2. A personal letter, **500 – 700 words** in length, discussing the following areas:
 - a. Your contributions and activities within the Jack Kerouac School, the university, and/or the local/national artistic community.
 - b. Recent accomplishments, current projects or publications of your work.
 - c. Your interest in attending the Summer Writing Program.
 - d. If you are applying for the Zora Neale Hurston Award, Aimee Grunberger Memorial Award, kari edwards, or the Scalapino Award additional information regarding your experience with specific populations should be included.
3. A writing sample of **5 – 10 pages** of your current poetry, prose, or translation.
4. Please save your complete application as a single document (form, letter and writing sample all as *one* document) with your last name and first name, and name of scholarship for which you are applying, and email to finaid@naropa.edu.

Deadline for Application: April 1, 2012, by 5 p.m. (MST) to finaid@naropa.edu

Decisions will be made by the Financial Aid Office in conjunction with a Scholarship Committee comprised of the Summer Writing Program, including the Chair of the Summer Writing Program. Decisions will be based on the quality of the individual's work, activities with the department/university, current projects/publications, and financial need.

Decisions on all awards will be made by May 1. All applicants will be notified by mail in May 2012.

Scholarships:

The Aimee Grunberger Memorial Award 2012

The Aimee Grunberger Memorial Award will be given to one nontraditional student who demonstrates excellence in the field of poetry. Applicants should be able to demonstrate their personal, artistic, and professional commitment to furthering respect for the lives and voices of women. Only students enrolled at Naropa University and noncredit SWP students are eligible.

The Zora Neale Hurston Award 2012

The Zora Neale Hurston Awards are given annually to two or three students who demonstrate experience in, or working with, populations of color, and who will be attending the Summer Writing Program for BA credit, MFA credit, or noncredit. Students of color are encouraged to apply.

Award Amount: Partial to full tuition (excluding registration fees, if any) and housing (for out-of-state recipients) for all four weeks of the Summer Writing Program at Naropa University.

Eligibility: Past recipients of the award are not eligible.

The Institute of American Indian Arts Award 2012

The Institute of American Indian Arts Award is given annually to one current undergraduate student enrolled at the Institute of American Indian Arts, who will be attending the Summer Writing Program.

Award Amount: Full tuition (excluding registration fees, if any) and housing (for out-of-state recipients) for all four weeks of the Summer Writing Program at Naropa University.

Eligibility: Undergraduate students currently enrolled at the Institute of American Indian Arts are eligible to apply.

The Summer Writing Program Scholarship in memory of kari edwards Award 2012

Beginning summer 2012, The Summer Writing Program Scholarship in memory of kari edwards will be offered each year to one credit or noncredit student accepted into Naropa University's Summer Writing Program.

Eligibility: Eligible applicants must demonstrate financial need, be a United States citizen or permanent resident of the United States, be involved in gender activism and writing experimental works, and successfully submit a Summer Writing Program Scholarship Application.

The Leslie Scalapino Award 2012

The Leslie Scalapino Award will be offered each year to one MFA Writing and Poetics or MFA Creative Writing student attending the Summer Writing Program who has a body of work in the field of experimental postmodern women's poetry and poetics.

Eligibility: Applicants must demonstrate financial need, be a United States citizen or permanent resident of the United States, and have a GPA of 3.5 or higher.
